Some QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

- Q. How much do we need to raise?
- A. \$2,250,000 in a 1-year capital stewardship campaign.
- Q. What is the timeline of the campaign?
- A. The Campaign will provide time for information during July, prayer/discernment in August and time for commitment starting the end of August, concluding with the September 28/29 Announcement Weekend.
- Q. When will I have an opportunity to make my financial commitment?
- A. First prayerfully reflect on your blessings and what a sacrificial pledge would mean in your life. Parishioners will be asked to confidentially register their financial commitments starting on commitment weekend which will be August 24/25.
- Q. What if I'm uncertain about my financial future?
- A. No one knows the future. But, EVERYONE should prayerfully consider what a sacrificial commitment would be. Should your circumstances change, you may alter your commitment by notifying the parish office. Pray to know God's direction and trust God as you are led.
- Q. How much will I be asked to give?
- A. You will not be told to give a specific amount. Everyone is asked to first reflect on his/her individual blessings and then pray about a *sacrificial* commitment to be paid <u>over the next year</u>. Your commitment should be *over and above* your current giving to the church.
- Q. What does "sacrificial" mean?
- A. A sacrificial commitment is one that requires you to change your lifestyle while fulfilling it.
- Q. How do I decide what I should commit to our capital stewardship campaign?
- A. Prayer and reflection! One of the campaign themes is "Not Equal Gifts, but Equal Sacrifice." Everyone is blessed differently. Everyone cannot give the same amount. But, if your gift is truly sacrificial... then the gifts are equal in the sight of God. "Every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the Lord your God which He has given you." Deuteronomy 16:17

Consider this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work. As it is written: "He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures forever." The one who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You are being enriched in every way for all generosity, which through us produces thanksgiving to God. 2 Corinthians 9:6-11

But just as you abound in everything, in faith and utterance and knowledge and in all earnestness and in the love we inspired in you, see that you abound in this gracious work also."

What is a capital stewardship campaign?

The process to raise the needed funds for building and maintaining our faith home. The campaign focuses on keeping everyone informed, answering questions and providing spiritual food for thought.

You'll receive mailings and be invited to presentations to learn more about the plans and how important your participation in this campaign is to the future of our parish.

Each of us will be asked to prayerfully consider a sacrificial commitment *over and above* our annual offertory support. No one will be pressured or told how much to give. Each of us is asked to give according to his/her blessings.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

If everyone accepts a small task, then together we can achieve our common goal! Here is a quick list of teams that are being assembled to help with the campaign. When asked, please say "YES" to assist with the campaign. Don't worry, no one will be asked to discuss, or talk to someone else about money.

Contact Team

A contact team will be built to make courtesy phone calls to parishioners prior to scheduled information meetings simply to ensure awareness and encourage attendance.

Hospitality Team

The hospitality team will provide any needed hospitality on our Commitment Weekend as well as encourage attendance.

Children and Youth Activities

The children and youth team will seek to get the children and youth involved in the campaign with activities to ensure their understanding and help them appreciate their God-given gifts to reinforce their learning about stewardship.

Mailing Team

A mailing team will be responsible to fold, stuff, label, etc. all campaign mailings.

Event (Commitment Weekend) Team

The team will plan, organize and coordinate all activities associated with commitment weekend to help make it a special/enjoyable time in the life of our parish.

Commitment Team

The commitment team will phone parishioners who have not yet made their intention known following commitment weekend simply to encourage them to register their intention. No one will be asked to convince anyone to participate.
